 - b. Governance documents
 - i. Charter
 - 1. Members shared concerns about:
 - a. Strictly following meeting agendas without leaving time for public comment
 - b. Where public comments would be included
 - c. Length and frequency of meetings
 - d. Proposal of in-person meetings (seconded and thirded); and roles of Chair and Vice Chair
 - 2. Facilitator confirmed the following:

- a. Agenda items will be adjusted or bumped to next meetings to allow time for public comment at the end of meetings and that public comments may be included as notes for the meeting
 - b. Charter will be updated without reference to a predetermined length and frequency of meetings to allow for flexibility
 - c. In-person meetings have been discussed with Ecology who are discussing the possibility and logistics; hybrid may be an option for accessibility
 - d. Duties and responsibilities of Chair and Vice Chair are flexible and dependent on those elected

- ii. Code of Ethics
 - 1. Members inquired about:
 - a. Voting power for delegates and clarification in the Code of Ethics
 - b. Form of communications within meetings
 - c. Procedure for member communications outside of meetings
 - d. Proposal to amend Code of Ethics to account for meetings outside of Council meetings
 - 2. Facilitator confirmed:

- a. Delegates will be able to vote in place of a member and Code of Ethics will be amended to clarify this
- b. Members should communicate in meetings using chat and reactions throughout the meeting
- c. Advisory Council will have a designated website with all meeting materials
- d. Official business will be conducted in Council meetings and subcommittee meetings
- e. Code of Ethics will be amended to include clarify that discussions made outside of Council and subcommittee meetings are not considered official business
- f. Code of Ethics will also include language on OPMA guidelines

- a. Review candidates and vote

 - 1. Member had questions about Danielle's experience
 - ii. McKenna Morrigan, Seattle Public Utilities

- b. Candidates provided brief speeches on desire to be Chair or Vice Chair
 - i. Nominees not elected for Chair agreed to be considered nominees for Vice Chair
- c. Members voted for Chair and Vice Chair anonymously
 - i. Chair votes:
 - 1. 8 votes for Rick; 7 votes for McKenna; 1 vote for Danielle; 1 non-vote
 - ii. Vice Chair votes:
 - 1. 11 votes for McKenna; 1 vote for Danielle; 5 non-votes
 - iii. In accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act, anonymous votes are not permitted and voting results are null
 - 1. Council will re-vote at the next meeting

 - i. Members inquired about:
 - 1. With the development of all this infrastructure, thoughts on overlap with reuse as infrastructure for deposit return could also support reuse
 - 2. Logistics on service provider registration deadlines and whether there is still opportunity to register even past the 2026 deadline
 - 3. Original intent around developing a separate infrastructure for the bottle bill outside of the retailers
 - 4. Connecting with tribes to facilitate information sharing
- V. Subcommittee updates
 - a. Equity subcommittee recruitment
 - i. Ecology shared update about Equity subcommittee statute:
 - 1. Comprised of 6 members – 3 from a small, medium, and large community in Eastern Washington
 - 2. Subcommittee will make recommendations to the Advisory Council, Ecology, and the PRO regarding impacts of the law on socially vulnerable populations and overburdened communities
 - ii. Current confirmed members:
 - 1. Miriam Mendoza, Yakima EcoSolutions
 - iii. Ming-Ming and Grant expressed interest in serving on Equity subcommittee
 - b. Subcommittee interest
 - i. Statewide lists subcommittee
 - 1. Karen, Becci, Michael expressed interest
 - ii. Needs assessment subcommittee
 - 1. Jay, Casey expressed interest
 - iii. Members interested in both: McKenna, Alissa, Danielle, Rick
 - iv. If only one subcommittee per person:
 - 1. Danielle indicated statewide lists as first choice
 - 2. Rick indicated needs assessment as first choice
 - v. Megan indicated wanting to be assigned to at least one subcommittee

- c. Member inquired to clarify whether people who are not on the Advisory Council are allowed to serve on subcommittees
 - i. Ecology confirmed this
